DECLARATION OF KAROLYN MCCALL

I, Karolyn McCall, hereby declare as follows:

- 1. I am over eighteen (18) years of age, and a cattle rancher in Dobbins, CA. I have personal knowledge of the facts set forth herein, and, if called as a witness, I could and would competently testify thereto.
- 2. I am one of Defendant/Respondent North Yuba Water District's ("NYWD") customers for agricultural water. I depend on NYWD's irrigation water to maintain my 143-acre sheep operation.
- 3. I purchased my property for its unique class one soil and large meadows. With this type of soil and large meadows I should only need to utilize hay 40–60 days a year. With the lack of water, however, I have to feed with hay for nearly half of the year.
- 4. As a direct result of the lack of water, I have also lost an irreplaceable ewe. The ewe died when she crawled into a pond that she normally drank from, but she became entrapped in what now is a sea of mud. The water that normally kept the pond full would have allowed her to walk safely to the edge to get a drink. This ewe was the product of flying frozen fertilized eggs out of Australia, obtained from a breed that can no longer be directly imported from their country of origin, South Africa.
- 5. The death of the ewe, itself, was not the only impact. The ewe was of special genetic stock, capable of producing significantly more meat than the typical sheep. The ewe was an investment in the future of my business, and, as a result of the unreliable supply of water provided by NYWD, this investment was lost.
- 6. Additionally, I have lost many trees, including 22 huge ponderosa pine trees and old oaks, thereby losing shade to my property and diminishing its value.
- 7. Last year, due to the fires, I had to evacuate my property. If we had had sufficient water for fire suppression, I would not have had to do so. When evacuating my property, I had to leave 100 head of sheep to fend for themselves. Because the risk of wildfires is constant around my property, there is a high chance that a fire will erupt again. Without NYWD's water, I will again be forced to evacuate and leave my livestock behind.

- 8. In fact, due to the high risk of fire and water woes, my fire insurance carrier cancelled my policy. Even though I live across the street from a Cal Fire station, I have not been able to find affordable fire insurance. Other neighbors are likewise forced to go without insurance or sell their properties due to the high fire insurance rates.
- 9. On April 20, 2021, I wrote to NYWD expressing these concerns, but have not received any response.

I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that the foregoing is true and correct and that this declaration was executed in Fresno, California on April 26, 2021.
